















What's Our Challenge?

The growth of AI requires new governance models where automation meets ethical standards, and addresses the needs of individuals and communities. For this new governance to sustain over time, discussions on the ethics of AI have to be inclusive and reflect a diverse set of voices and perspectives.

What's the Al Civic Forum?

Al Civic Forum (AICF) is a pioneering platform to proactively engage citizens across the world in the governance of AI.

Anchored in robust collective intelligence methodologies, the AI Civic Forum designs and manages civic debates combining online consultations and face-to-face workshops involving diverse communities of citizens, policymakers, experts, industry, civil society, and other key stakeholders in the ethical design, deployment, and governance of AI. This deliberative process empowers individuals and communities to shape AI's trajectory.
